2. Partner Endorsements & Policy Request – Joey, Samantha, Laura	<p>Joey and Samantha are updating a previously used T21 endorsement letter to include a flavor ban and including vaping into the local clean indoor air act, and then sending it to organizations that previously endorsed T21 in Lawrence. Joey, Samantha, and Laura are creating a one-pager that includes research about harms of tobacco specifically for youth as well as some policy ideas to address the problems laid out.</p> <p>“Here is a sample policy we created with Public Health Law Center and based on what other communities have passed”.</p>	<p>Joey will send the group the one-pager and research brief feedback</p> <p>Are there any new partners we want to engage in the advocacy?</p>
3. Campus Survey – Aftan	<p>Did not get approval to send out the vaping survey via KU student emails, so the survey is not KU-owned. However, the survey is not owned by LiveWell, so the survey can be sent out to other universities – Baker and Haskell. Aftan has reached out to some professors on KU campus already as well. Boys and Girls Club has some social work practicum students/agreements which might be one avenue for getting the survey out. Samantha sent the survey out to Pan-Hellenic. 	<p>Edits to the survey?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - adding demographics to the survey, including race/ethnicity - maybe adding a disclaimer about the survey being around commercial tobacco use, not ceremonial use - change the question about disposing of the vape product to be asked about peers rather than if the person themselves is disposing of it so they're not responding with a social acceptability bias 	<p>advocating for tobacco policy on campus. Laura has reached out recently to the chair of the IRB at Haskell about a different survey and can reach out again when we are ready to send the survey to Haskell as well.</p>
4. Tobacco Retailer Survey Update	<p>Going really well. Dr Harvey was not expecting such a good response rate from retailers. A couple interesting things– one business said they were “exempt” from the T21 law so they were still able to sell to people 18 and over; a manager at another facility shared that they were not aware of the T21 law but when she called at a different time another manager was aware of the law.</p>
